Zinio (Downloadable magazines) is Coming!

We are excited to announce that the Library will soon be offering Zinio to our patrons. Zinio features full-color, digital editions for instant desktop reading, mobile streaming, and mobile-app download. Patrons will be able to select both new and back issues from over 60 titles, adding them to personal reading libraries with no holds, no check-out periods, and no limits to the number of magazines checked out and downloaded. And with personal notifications for their favorite magazines, patrons never miss an issue!



The service will be available soon. Check with staff and watch our Facebook, Twitter, and web site pages for an announcement of when it is operational. **Note: You will need to enter your library barcode number when you set up your Zinio account, so this is a**

great time to renew your card if it is expired or to get one if you don't have one already.

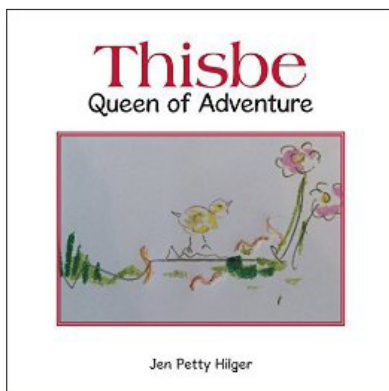
SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Victorian Fashions – Real or Not: “decidedly a pretty looking little creature” with Susan Jerome
Saturday, April 29 at 2:00 P.M.

We think of the Victorian era as a time of restrictions, especially with women's clothing. But is this a true understanding of the fashions worn during this time period?

Queen Victoria, by inheriting the throne at an early age and living into her eighties, endowed much of the nineteenth century with her name. She reigned during a time of great advancements in science and social beliefs, and these changes were reflected in the notable evolution of women's, children's, and men's clothing.

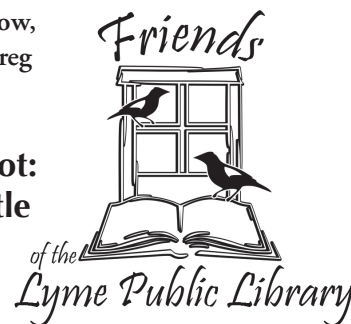
This program explores the many changes that occurred throughout the Victorian era and how these influenced fashion. We will look at what was stylish - real or otherwise – during this most fashionable time.

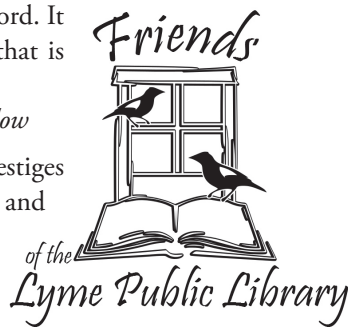
