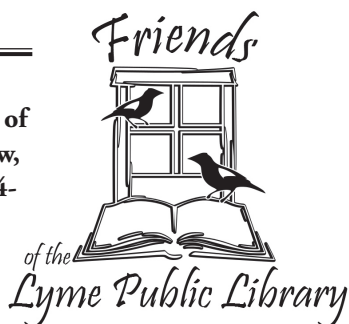
Open Studio – Still Life with Kristen Thornton

Up Close with Raptors Presented by Rose Cresi, founder of Blue Moon Raptors

Saturday, February 25 2017 at 2:00 P.M.

Blue Moon raptors is an organization geared to rehabilitate ill, injured, and orphaned birds of prey in order to return them back to their natural habitat when possible. Ms. Cresi will have live birds with her—two kestrels (who have been brought to her from Maine for rehab), a barn owl and two other birds of prey. She will discuss the birds, the rehabilitation of the birds, and talk about the important role the birds have in our ecosystem.

In addition, Ms. Cresi will cover what we can do to preserve the environment so raptors may continue to enrich our planet.

Saturday, March 25, 2017 at 2:00 P.M.

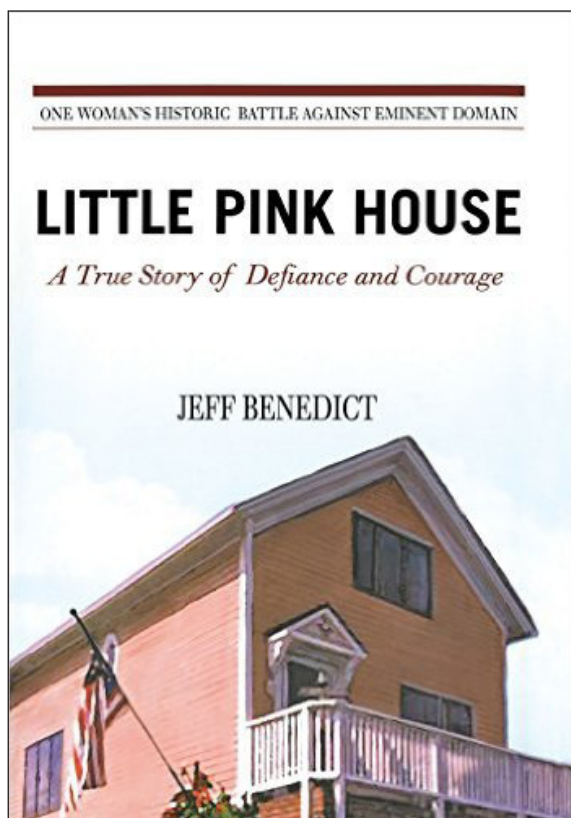
In this talk, Professor Borrelli will discuss the politics, policy, and power of the presidents' wives throughout the modern presidency. Come and enjoy a conversation that is both historical and timely, examining the contributions of the men and women who have won the White House.

MaryAnne Borrelli, a graduate of Wellesley College, Boston College and Harvard University, joined the faculty of Connecticut College in 1992. She is a Professor of Government at Connecticut College. Her research focuses on gender and the U.S. presidency, and she has participated in the White House Transition Project, which has mentored both Democratic and Republican White House staff members. The author and editor of several books and articles, her most recent book is *The Politics of the President's Wife*.


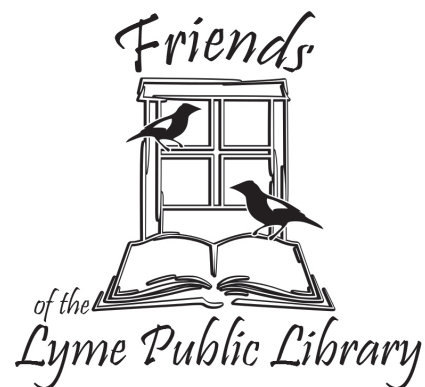
Guests and new members are welcome. Copies of the titles are available at the circulation desk 3-4 weeks before each discussion.
