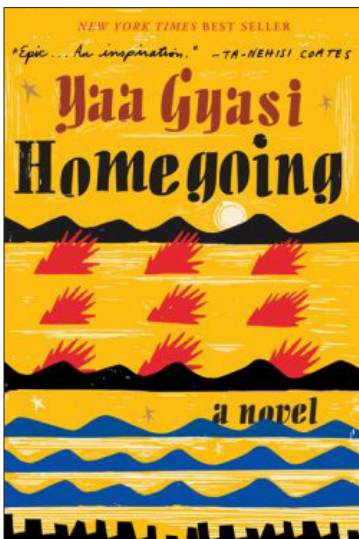
Gillette Castle: a History by Erik Ofgang - Thursday, October 12, 6:00 P.M.

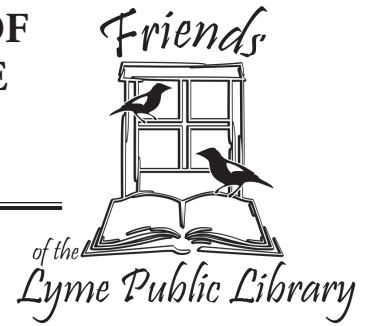
