Wi-Fi Hotspot Available for Loan

The Library is now offering a Sprint portable Pocket Wi-Fi Hotspot for loan. The device can offer connectivity for up to 10 devices anywhere 3G or 4G service is available.Borrowers must be at least 18 years of age, have lived in Lyme for at least 90 days, and must have a library card in good standing. The device may be borrowed for one week and cannot be renewed or reserved. Not sure why you might need a Wi-Fi hotspot? Check out the Top Ten List below or ask the staff for more information.

Top Ten Reasons to Check Out the Library's Pocket Wi-Fi Hotspot

Water Babies, a Slide/Lecture Presentation by William Burt: Thursday, October 6 at 7:00 P.M.



Naturalist, writer, and photographer William Burt will preview his upcoming new book *Water Babies: The Hidden Lives of Baby Wetland Birds* with a slide/lecture presentation. The "babies" are the downy young of ducks, grebes, gallinules and shorebirds, herons, and the other birds of wetlands – those that get their feet wet, as it were – and challenging they are, to birder and photographer alike: quick-footed, wary, and well-

camouflaged, to say the least; and temporary (you have only a week or two each year in which to find them). But above all else, they are endearing. From the comic-monster herons to the fuzzy ducklings and stick-legged sandpipers, these tots have personality, and spunk. You see it in their faces, every one.

You'll see the parent birds of wetlands in this slide presentation, too. Each downy chick is juxtaposed with the adult it will become.

To photograph these youngsters and adults, the author prowled their wetland breeding grounds each spring and summer for some 7 years, all over North America, from the Arctic Circle to the Gulf of Mexico. The result: a portrait of these wild birds of the wetlands as both young and old, unknown and known, new and familiar.

Blue Madonna – Book Reading and Signing by James R. Benn: Saturday, October 8 at 2:00 P.M.






He has written fifteen books on topics ranging from violence against women to a deadly E. coli outbreak to the discovery of a 10,000-year-0ld skeleton in North America.

He is also an executive producer on the forthcoming motion picture film "Little Pink House," starring Catherine Keener and Jeanne Tripplehorn. The movie is based on his book by the same title, and is the true story of the eminent domain case Kelo v. City of New London that was decided by the U.S. Supreme Court in 2005.
